Speaker: Seamus O'Brien, Ireland's leading plantsman and manager of the National Botanic Gardens of Ireland Kilmacurragh. He has traveled extensively around the globe in search of plants and is a member of the Royal Historical Society Woody Plant Committee, and the Chairman of the RHS Rhododendron Camellia and Magnolia Group. In 2018, he was awarded the RHS of Ireland Gold Medal of Honour and in January 2022 he received the Loder Rhododendron Cup in recognition of his work in the conservation of rhododendrons and other plants.

He has thoroughly investigated these mountains, resulting, among other things, in the discovery of new species, as well as recovered species, that were believed to no longer exist. He often finds places that are not usually visited by other horticulturists. He has been giving lectures for over 25 years and has visited almost all the European countries as a speaker. After many years of working with alpine plants, he has been honored by having two plants named after him, Saxifraga "Kaj Andersen" and Saxifraga "Viking." Both are hybrids from Karel Lang, who endeavors to promote good horticulture through his business in the Czech Republic. He has a small alpine nursery where he germinates and grows alpines, using only wild-collected seeds gleaned from all corners of the world.
